#### **Course Objectives**

Film Studies is designed to help students enrich their understanding of the world of film and the media arts. We will explore the film making process, theme recognition, artist intent, film history, and critical analysis.

#### Expectations

1. We are expected to show respect at all times to ourselves, others in the classroom, and the classroom itself.

We are expected to be attentive, courteous, and not interrupt others when they are addressing the class.
 We are expected to only use classroom materials while in the classroom (cell phones, iPods, food, drinks, gum, personal grooming accessories, etc. are prohibited in the classroom).

\*\*\*Small snacks are allowed <u>during film viewing</u> as long as they are clean, silent, and not smelly! 4. Stay in assigned seat on task during the entire class period unless instructed by the teacher to do otherwise.

Living up to these expectations will allow you to find a deeper enjoyment in film viewing, make some new friends, and never lose your social media device so you can stay in contact with those new friends (after class!) <sup>(i)</sup>

Not living up to these expectations will result in disciplinary action:

- ✓ Teacher Warning/Confiscation of non-approved electronic device/Loss of Participation points
- ✓ Removal from class.
- Parent/Guardian Notification.
- ✓ Sent to Assistant Principal.
- ✓ Conference with Parent, Student, Teacher, and Administrator.

\*\*\*\*\*The following student behaviors will result in immediately being sent to an Assistant Principal: <u>Insubordination, Overt Defiance</u>, and <u>Significant Classroom Disruption</u>.

#### Movies/Videos

Movies and/or clips will be shown daily. All videos are district approved with a G, PG or PG-13 rating. No "R" rated movies will be shown in the class.

#### Policies

CHHS policy for attendance will be upheld in regards to receiving a grade in this class:

Students will be allowed zero truancies (sluffs), 2 excused absences or 3 tardies before receiving a "no grade."
 Upon the first sluff, third absence or fourth tardy, students will receive no credit (NG) for the class unless and until a session of Attendance School is made up for each absence or tardy.

3. One session of Attendance School will count for one absence or two tardies.

4. Two sessions of Attendance School are required to make up a sluff.

5. Students wishing to make up tardies must attend the entire session of Attendance School and will receive credit for two tardies.

\*I (Mr. Simpson) do not hold individual attendance school sessions.

Attendance: All students are expected to attend class. A maximum of 20 points is given for being on time, attentive, and involved in class work for the entire period.

**Tardies**: Each student must be ready to start when the bell rings so that s/he may gain the full benefit of the day's activities and not disrupt the educational opportunity of others. Tardiness is defined as arriving in the classroom within 10 minutes of the class starting bell. Each class period is worth 20 participation points. A tardy deducts five points from the day's participation points. Points deducted for an unexcused tardy cannot be made-up.

Absences: If absences are planned in advance (e.g. school activities or family vacations) or for extended medical reasons, arrangements need to be made with me prior to missing class. Absences for any other reason need to be excused in accordance with school policy. It is the student's responsibility to talk to the teacher during NON-CLASS time to find out what s/he missed and make it up. Lost participation points because of an absence can usually be made up. If you miss the viewing of a film, you must find your own way to secure a copy of the film and watch it—YOU ARE STILL RESPONSIBLE FOR THE MATERIAL THAT FILM COVERS!!! I will not let you borrow the school copy—ever!

• Late Work: All assignments are due on the date specified in class. All assignments turned in past the due date are accepted late during the quarter. 5 points will be deducted for everyday past the due date that an assignment is turned in. The exception will be long-term assignments that note a specified due date on the requirement sheet. It is worth your time to watch all of the films and complete all of the assigned paper work. Please note that I will not accept late work after the last day of each quarter.

Student information, work, and grades will be kept confidential and will not be shared without the necessary authorization as per FERPA Regulations - See JSD Policy.

#### Dear Parents,

The movies we will watch in class will be drawn from the list on the back of this sheet. We will use many of these movies to support the elements of film we study during the semester. Please review the list with your student. If you (or your student) have questions, concerns, or there are films **you do not want your student to view**, please e-mail me at **jonathan.simpson@jordandistrict.org**. Alternate films will be offered as necessary. We watch approximately 20 movies per semester. Keep this list for future reference.

As per Jordan District policy, high school students may view "videos with MPAA ratings of G and PG. PG-13 videos may only be used after obtaining parent permission". If parent permission is required to view a video, the Jordan District policy is as stated:

- Notify students' parent/guardian in writing at least five (5) days prior to showing the video. Notification may be sent for individual videos or teachers may include, in their disclosure statement, a list of video titles that will be used in the class, accompanied by the approximate dates for the intended showing of each video. Teachers must indicate a parent/guardian response period of not less than five (5) days. If the teacher is not contacted by a student's parent/guardian within the designated notification period, the teacher shall determine that consent for the student to view the video has been granted.
- Keep correspondence on file from parents who respond that they do not want their child to view the identified video(s) and provide an appropriate alternative assignment for those students.


